Olympic Fencer Joins FCSC Advisory Board

The Commission welcomes Galya Pundyk, an Olympic gold medal winning fencer, to our advisory board. Galya, who lives in Easton, is the assistant fencing coach for sabre at Yale University. She is a world-class fencer who helped lead the Ukraine National Team to gold at the 2008 Beijing Olympics as well as being a two-time gold and three-time silver world champion. Pundyk recently opened the Olympian Fencing Studio in Wilton.

She already has a tie to FCSC as her fiancée Will Boe-Wiegaard, the men's and women's tennis coach at Sacred Heart University and former touring pro, was our Easton Sports Person of the Yearin 2011. Galya joins two other Olympic gold medal winners on our advisory board in soccer's Kristine Lilly and women's hockey's Sue Merz as well as Olympic pairs figure skater Lea Ann Miller.
